Background

- The Chronic Disease Co-Care Pilot Scheme ("CDCC") was launched in Nov 2023, providing subsidised screening and disease management services to citizens aged
 45 or above, without known history of diabetes mellitus ("DM") or hypertension ("HT")
- In line with the Government's policy direction to consolidate primary healthcare resources, the CDCC will expand its target groups in phases to cover:



Suitable patients attending the **Family Medicine Clinics** ("FMCs") of the **Hospital Authority** ("HA")

AND




Eligible patients participating in the **General Outpatient Clinic Public- Private Partnership Programme** ("GOPC PPP")


The GOPC PPP is planned to conclude in 2028

Expansion of CDCC Treatment Phase

Eligible Citizens (aged 45+, without known history of DM or HT)



Suitable HA FMC Patients (aged 18+)



Treatment Phase





Starting Jan 2026









Special Invitations

- CDCC Programme Office ("PO") will invite eligible **HA FMC and GOPC PPP** patients by post, in phases
- Eligible patients who are interested in joining will enter directly into CDCC
 Treatment Phase
- All enrolled patients will have the same co-payment fees and service arrangements as all other CDCC participants in the Treatment Phase




Issued by CDCC PO

Arrangements for GOPC PPP Patients

- CDCC PO will invite suitable GOPC PPP patients (HT and/or DM, originally referred from HA FMCs) in phases to join CDCC Treatment Phase
- All eligible patients will be given 12 months after receiving invitations to decide
- Patients can join CDCC at:
 - (Starting Jan 2026) District Health Centres / Expresses ("DHC/Es")
 - (Starting Feb 2026 TBC) Doctors' clinics, if:
 - * Their doctors joined both CDCC & GOPC PPP; AND
 - ❖ Patients continue to pair with the same doctors in CDCC



- Patients not joining CDCC can choose to:
 - Return to HA
 - Receive care in private sector at own costs



GOPC PPP Patient Enrolment Workflow





GOPC PPP Patients







For patients paired with doctors who have joined GOPC PPP ONLY (not yet joined CDCC)

For patients paired with doctors who have joined BOTH CDCC & GOPC PPP



Patients receive invitations from CDCC PO



Call Centre proactively contacts patients to promote CDCC



HA Cluster PPP Offices ("HA CPPPOs") transfer patient case summaries to DHC/Es





Current doctors

- Register patients as DHC members &
- **Enrol the patients in CDCC at doctors' clinics**

(Patients must pair with the same doctor)

Patient's Choice and Doctor's Involvement



CDCC Doctors: Receiving New Patients from GOPC PPP



- GOPC PPP patients joining CDCC may request to pair with you via DHC/Es
- DHC/Es will handle the enrolment and pairing procedures
- You may view their GOPC PPP consultation summaries and lab results in eHR Viewer
- You will receive support from DHC/Es as patients' case manager and care coordinator
- Enrolled patients' co-payment amounts, consultation quotas, and service coverage are the same as other CDCC participants in Treatment Phase


For CDCC Doctors Who Have Joined GOPC PPP

Your existing GOPC PPP patients can:

- 1 Join CDCC and continue to pair with you
- 2 Join CDCC and pair with a different doctor
- 3 Return to HA
- 4 Remain under your care at their own costs



GOPC PPP Patients Continue Care under You



- Starting Jan 2026, DHC/Es will be the coordinator to handle the enrolment and pairing
- Starting Feb 2026 (TBC), Doctors can:
 - Invite your patients to join CDCC (even before they receive special invitations)
 - Enrol them directly at your clinic using CDCC's "Participant Enrolment at doctors' clinics" function
 - Only applicable to patients currently under your care in GOPC PPP
 - They must **continue to pair with you to join CDCC** at your clinic
 - ❖ You will receive \$76 from the Government per each successful enrolment to CDCC
- Same co-payment fees, subsidies and service arrangements as other CDCC participants

2 GOPC PPP Patients Switch Doctors




Patient's Choice

- Your existing GOPC PPP patients may choose to pair with a different doctor when joining CDCC
- DHC/Es will handle the enrolment and pairing with new doctors
- HA Cluster PPP Offices ("HA CPPPOs") will inform you of the switch

Clinical Handover


- Timely and complete input of clinical information in the GOPC PPP IT system
 - DHC/Es and new CDCC doctors may review the latest records in eHR Viewer

3 GOPC PPP Patients Return to HA



- Your patients not joining CDCC may return to HA in phases
- GOPC PPP PO will coordinate this arrangement with HA CPPPOs and inform you of the timing of patient return
- Patients will be contacted individually on their return arrangement
- Please continue to provide care under GOPC PPP until patients return to HA
- Timely input of relevant clinical information in the GOPC PPP IT system
 - HA clinical team may view the latest records in eHR Viewer

4 GOPC PPP Patients Remain under Your Care at Own Costs



- Your patients not joining CDCC may continue to receive care from you at own costs
- You may continue to provide services to them under GOPC PPP until its planned conclusion in 2028
- This arrangement is outside the scope of GOPC PPP and CDCC, and must be mutually agreed between you and your patients

GOPC PPP Doctors Still Considering Joining CDCC




- ✓ Joining CDCC offers your GOPC PPP patients the option to continue to receive care from you
- ✓ CDCC covers a wider range of chronic diseases and has an expanding drug list, with support from DHC/Es and multidisciplinary teams
- ✓ CDCC Programme Office and a designated FD hotline to support your enrolment in CDCC

CDCC can help you continue to provide a more comprehensive and multidisciplinary care to your patients!

GOPC PPP Patients Successfully Joined CDCC: Termination in GOPC PPP Services

- After joining CDCC, patients will no longer be eligible for services under GOPC PPP
- The GOPC PPP IT system will display a prompt message indicating patients' enrolment in CDCC
- New GOPC PPP service entries will be barred for these patients
- You may still access and update previous GOPC PPP consultation records after patients' enrolment in CDCC until the conclusion of GOPC PPP
- Consultation records will remain available in eHR Viewer after the end of GOPC PPP programme


Please input Consultation Records promptly for all GOPC PPP patients

Reimbursement claims submitted by the 10th of each month will be processed in the same month





Click [Participant Enrolment] under "Participant" module of the landing page.




















