The sharing consent period to the concerned PH will be defaulted as "indefinite".

- After successful registration of eHealth and giving the sharing consents to the concerned PH, the patients will receive notifications. To facilitate the patients in receiving notifications from the eHealth, mobile SMS will be used for the communication means and the communication language will be defaulted as Chinese.

- Before attending PH for Programme service, referred patient should bring along his/her Hong Kong Identity Card for identity verification and attendance registration.

Fees and Charges

Under the Programme, patients are required to pay to the PH the same HA standard fees and charges for the Trauma Operative services as stipulated in the Gazette. Patients who are eligible for a waiver to receive the HA services will enjoy the same fee waiver arrangements in the Programme². Currently the charges for Eligible Person are:

Note

Eligible Person (EP):

- If any referred patient ceases to be an Eligible Person at any time after his/ her enrolment in the Programme, such referred patient shall notify HA and he/she shall not be entitled to receive any services under the Programme during the period when he/ she is not an Eligible Person.
- PH shall be responsible for verifying if a referred patient is an Eligible Person via the IT system immediately before attending to the referred patient for each episode of service. If the referred patient is not an Eligible Person on the day of attendance, any services which may be provided by the PH to such referred patient shall be considered as the private arrangement between the PH and the referred patient and at the patient's own cost.

Attendance Registration:

- Before attending PH for Programme service, referred patient should bring along his/her Hong Kong Identity Card for identity verification and attendance registration. PH shall register attendance for the patient via one of the following means:
 - 1) Smart-ID; 2) One-time password; or 3) Attendance Sheet
- Upon successful attendance registration, referred patient would receive a confirmation message generated from eHealth, which is based on the referred patient's choice of eHealth communication means including mobile SMS or E-mail or Postal.

Services beyond Programme Package:

- Other than the above mentioned services to be provided by PH, any additional services (such as medical reports ordered by or for a referred patient which fall outside the Programme Package), shall be considered as the private arrangement between the PH and the referred patient and at the patient's own cost.

Prevention of Bribery:

- The Hospital Authority prohibits its employees, agents and service providers who are involved in this programme from offering, soliciting or accepting any advantage as defined in the Prevention of Bribery Ordinance (Cap. 201) in connection with this programme. Hence, programme participants and their families should not offer any advantage to the above persons.

¹ Definition of Eligible Person (EP):

- a. holders of Hong Kong Identity Card issued under the Registration of Persons Ordinance (Chapter 177), except those who obtained their Hong Kong Identity Card by virtue of a previous permission to land or remain in Hong Kong granted to them and such permission has expired or ceased to be valid;
- b. children who are Hong Kong residents and under 11 years of age; or
- c. other persons approved by the Chief Executive of the Hospital Authority.
- ² An applicant who is eligible for a waiver under the criteria set out below is entitled to enjoy the same fee waiver arrangements as for the HA's services when he/she attends the Programme:
 - a. Comprehensive Social Security Assistance Recipient.
 - b. Certificate Holder for Full or Partial Waiver of Medical Charges.
 - c. Civil Service Eligible Person (CSEP).
 - d. HA Eligible Person.
 - e. Old Age Living Allowance Recipient aged 75 or above.
 - f. Level 0 Voucher Holder of the Residential Care Service Voucher Scheme for the Elderly.
- ³ The HA standard fees and charges include charges for laboratory investigations and x-ray examinations.
- ⁴ Each chargeable unit covers a duration of up to a 16-week supply of a drug item. Prescriptions are charged in multiples of chargeable unit at \$15 per unit for each drug (except self-financed drugs).
- ⁵ For inpatient cases transferred from HA to the Private Hospital for inpatient service, patients are not required to pay admission fee at the Private Hospital.
- ⁶ Maintenance fee will be levied on daily basis from day of admission with cut-off time set at 12:00 midnight. If a patient is discharged within same date of admission, one-day maintenance fee will be levied on the first day.
